## September Vestry Meeting Highlights

Bernie Schultz opened the meeting with a prayer of Teresa Avila who lived in the 16th Century. The idea was that we are the hands, feet, and eyes of Christ in this world. If Christ is to act in this world it is through us.

Special guest Nancy Mosser reported on the foundation and crack monitoring. The surveyors have come and placed gauges as well as establishing data points both inside and outside the church. This will enable us to more precisely determine whether there is movement and whether cracks are getting wider and will inform future actions. We are also going to move forward with plans to seal the cracks that now exist.

We have \$265,000 in a checking account so we are

going to transfer \$50,000 to a six month certificate of deposit, \$50,000 to a nine month certificate of deposit, and \$50,000 to a twelve month certificate of deposit.

Although he was not there to present the report, Jeff Fedan reported that the Property Committee had been busy, painting, installing signs, having the mowers serviced, etc. The renovation of the rector's office is coming along; it is awaiting windows, doors, tile, carpet, and desk. We are also getting a new coffee maker, thanks to a generous gift.

In light of the new COVID variant and an increase in cases, we are going to re-establish the socially distanced area on the far left section of the church.

The new organ will arrive in late September or the early part of October.

Father Delk reported that he has been doing pastoral care, visiting newcomers, and meeting with committees. Attendance is on the rise; it is not a smooth, steady rise but on the whole the trend is upward.

He has ideas on stewardship. If we are going to have programs we need money to support them. He hopes to reconstitute the Stewardship Committee and meet soon with an idea of an ingathering on November 15.

Sunday School is going well. Attendance has been small but those leading it see a potential for growth. Father Delk has been facilitating the meetings of teachers and those interested. It would be good to have more teachers.

Scott Williams will be ordained as a deacon on October 28. Once that happens, he will no longer be a member of either St. Thomas à Becket or the vestry. Since our long term goal is to shrink the size of vestry, we are not going to replace him. We will wait until next meeting to decide who will be the new Secretary.
