#### Formation Class: Survey of the Bible



Below is the information about the book as found on Amazon From childhood through law school and into professional practice, Michael Sharley pursued his goals

despite his severe cerebral palsy. As a defense lawyer representing those at the margins of society, he found that his clients, too, were treated as something less than equals in a world that favors "regular, normal" people. In a lively, engaging voiceand with a hint of humor-he sardonic shares some of the burdens borne by people with disabilities, some professional anecdotes,



some outspoken observations on the state of justice in America, and the story of his own decisive encounter with the forces of conformity.

### February Vestry Meeting Highlights

We have had an igniter replaced on one of our furnaces. We have had the remaining five furnaces serviced. The technician who worked on them reported that they were all about 30 years old (original equipment when the building was expanded). We are in good shape now but they are approaching their dotage. We are probably looking at replacing them some time in the next three years. The last furnace we replaced cost about \$8,000.

There have been difficulties with earth movement under and around the church in the past, manifesting itself in cracks. Corey and Linda Yost measured the cracks about two years ago and did not detect any recent movement. There is now available more sophisticated monitoring equipment which we can install and track movement, if any, more precisely.

A student of organist Bill Haller has been using our organ to practice. Now she wants to use the church for her recital. The Vestry would not object and would not want to charge her a fee.

Natalie is working on the Parochial Report. In addition to objective numbers such as attendance, etc. it also asks more open ended questions about future plans, etc. She is going to circulate the open ended questions to the Vestry to see if anyone has ideas.

Last month Al reported that there might be a difficulty with the copyright on the music we use. Now Al has done some checking and concluded that we are in good shape. If it turns out that there is a violation, the consequences would be small.

There has been some movement toward a Sunday School program. There have been a couple of volunteers to form a committee to work on a plan.

Beth Royall raised the issue of credit cards. We have cards from Office Depot and Lowes which we use to purchase supplies. We also have a MasterCard issued by Kroger which we use to buy flowers. Now the Outreach Committee wants to start regularly buying supplies for the Rock Forge Pantry and would find it more convenient to use the Kroger-issued credit card for this. The Vestry voiced no objection.

Bernie Schultz reported on the proposed strategic plan. Last Fall, Bernie and Carol Beall distributed a questionnaire to Vestry members and prepared a document containing our current mission statements, the responses from Vestry members, and some suggestions moving forward. He has since revised that document for the Vestry members to review. The next step will be a discussion among the Vestry, followed by a discussion with the entire congregation. The discussion will include finances since we have some major expenditures looming (organ, furnaces, maybe correcting earth movement).

Bernie Schultz wants to do a program on the Passion of Christ in Art. It would involve readings from the Bible followed with examples of how those passages have been treated in artistic works. He would make the presentation during or instead of coffee hour on March 19. The Vestry is enthusiastic about this, as is Bernie.
