During his first semes-

ters at UMich Joseph pursued basic engineering courses and used the forced time online to complete the required math sequence by the end of his first year. By his second year, he had decided to major in Mechanical Engineering while taking enough Computer Science, math, and Electrical Engineering courses to be able to pursue work in the growing field of robotics.

Joseph's academic career came into sharp focus in January 2022 when the UMich Robotics Institute announced that it would become a full department with its own faculty and a new undergraduate major. Joseph met with robotics faculty and interested students and changed his course schedule to include classes in dynamics, control, and robotics-related math. As one of the first students in the new department, he was able to get to know the faculty, staff, and graduate students at a level that is often difficult for undergrads in a large university. Working as a teaching assistant and lab instructor also gave him opportunities to meet people across the academic spectrum.

This summer Joseph is a second-year research intern at Amazon Robotics in Boston. He plans to return to Ann Arbor in the fall to pursue an MSE in Robotics. Over the next one to two years, Joseph hopes to refine his interests to a sub-field of robotics and to give his input on the continuing development of the new undergraduate program. Joseph deeply appreciates his department's commitment both to diversity among students and faculty and to applications of robotics that will be helpful to people in everyday life.

Rose Fedan is graduating from Amherst, Ohio's Marion L. Steele High School with an Honors degree. She

will be attending Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio this fall as a member of the Honors Learning Community. Rose has accepted an academic scholarship from Bowling Green as well as a Music Scholarship to participate in the university's Philhar-



monic Orchestra. She is also the recipient of the Joann Manley Scholarship.

Rose has been a dedicated musician in her school orchestra as well as the Northern Ohio Youth Orchestra. Rose plans to major in Visual Communication Technology and minor in Art with a concentration in Ceramics. She will be studying this summer at a weekend workshop in Pennsylvania with renowned British potter, Simon Leach.

May Vestry Meeting Highlights

Treasurer Beth Royall reported that we had made a deposit on the foundation repair which was not in the budget. Had we not made this extraordinary expenditure, the expenses for the year would be \$25,000 less than we budgeted. Much of this is a result of our having budgeted for having a rector for half the year and not having had one.

We are going to spend up to \$2,000 from the Sunday School Fund for snacks, materials, and decorations.

Junior Warden Jeff Fedan was absent but he had prepared a report. The foundation work will begin May 22, weather permitting. The grass cutting arrangements have been worked out; he is meeting with the plumber about the faucet in the kitchen; HVAC filters have been changed; arrangements have been made to illuminate the brick wall below the steeple; signs are being added or improved, including a new sign out on the big road, Route 857.

We are also going to spruce up the rector's office and get a new computer for the treasurer. The current one is old and is becoming uncooperative. If this continues it may require our treasurer to speak some uncharacteristically harsh words, a result we want to avoid.

Because one of the applicants has withdrawn from consideration, we had two applications for the Amy Marshall Robins Scholarship: Katherine Henneberger and Samantha Carver. As both were excellent candidates, we divided the available money (\$3,300) evenly between the two.

Deacon Al reported that he has been to the clergy conference and now he is off to Iona. The Bishop plans to replace Iona with another program so Al will soon be finished with that. Timothy Allen and Chris Scott are still scheduled to be ordained as deacons on May 31.

Bernie Schultz reported on the proposed strategic plan. It is still evolving, now in its fifth draft. There was some discussion and Bernie is still accepting email suggestions. The general plan is to distribute it to the congregation, announce it during church, and then discuss it at coffee hour.
