The Reverend Michael L. Delk, a native Kentuckian, took his Bachelor's in Religion magna cum laude with departmental Honors from Transylvania University in Lexington, Kentucky, and his Master's in Divinity degree with Honors from Virginia Theo-

logical Seminary in Alexandria, Virginia. During his time in seminary, Father Michael spent a semester abroad at Oxford University, and completed his Clinical Pastoral Education at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania in west Philadelphia.

Over the past 25 years, he has served as the Assistant to the Rector at The Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd in Lexington, Kentucky; as Canon for Youth, Young Adults, and Communications at The Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta, Georgia; as Rector of Hickory Neck Episcopal Church in Toano, Virginia, and as Rector of St. Luke's Episcopal Church, in Anchorage, Kentucky (east Louisville).

Father Michael has two children: Ben, 21; and Ed, 19. In his spare time, he enjoys reading, movies, day

hikes in the mountains, and playing video games with his sons.

He begins his tenure as Rector of St. Thomas à Becket on August 1, 2023. There will be an **Ice Cream Social Meet & Greet after the service on August 6**.

July Vestry Meeting Highlights

Since the vestry learned at its last meeting that the previous plan to stabilize the church building would not work, there was much discussion of what to do. We had had a visit from a structural engineer who looked at all the cracking in the building. Nancy Mosser, who has done a lot of work on this, also had available to her the report prepared for the inspection and remediation work that we had done in 2014. This work included work on the driveway so that water was directed away from the building. The engineer who came recently had reviewed the report from the engineer who evaluated the problem in 2014 and had a similar analysis.

We plan to follow the engineer's recommendation and gather more data before we decide what, if anything, we should do. We are going to have the cracks professionally measured and have a surveyor record the current plumb and levelness of the building. The surveyor would come monthly for a year. With the additional data we will decide what we need to do.

Jeff Fedan presented the report of the Property Com-

mittee; they have been busy as beavers this month: pulling weeds, cleaning gutters, trimming bushes, fixing toilet in women's room, installing new phones, installing an exit sign and a sign on the downhill curve, replacing light fixtures, hanging a picture donated by Schultzes in the nursery, etc.

And here's more! Jeff has contacted the person who is going to do the driveway sealant; the job is scheduled for September 8, and everyone will have to stay off the driveway Friday, September 8–Saturday, September 9. Jeff and Natalie have met with PACE, the company which cleans the church. Together they produced a list of things, including stocking the supplies in the bathrooms, which needed to be done regularly. In the future, the company will check off items on the list as they are completed.

Jeff also announced that a donor has offered to renovate the rector's office. It involves painting, drywall sealing, electrical work, lights, a new door as well as other things. The estimate for the work is \$23,000. The donor will also arrange for bookshelves to be built.

A donor has also offered to fix up the memorial garden. That project is not nearly so far along. We have a general plan of what would be done but no estimates.

We are lifting the last of our COVID restrictions by removing the suggestions of requirements of distancing and mask-wearing in the far left section.

The new rector has found a house and plans to move in about July 29.

Parish Administrator Natalie Homer reported that she will be on vacation from August 21 to 29. Linda Yost has agreed to fill in for her.
